Directions: Skytrain (BTS): For many the most enjoyable way to the Grand Palace is by taking the BTS Skytrain to station Saphan Taksin and then take a Chao Phraya River Express boat to the Maharaj Pier. It is a short walk from pier to the palace. Simply exit the peer and walk out straight through a small market. The Palace will be across the road to your right with its corner wall clearly visible. If you took a right at the wall you'd come to Wat Pho. For the palace entrance walk across the road and along the wall you saw stretching out in front of you when you exited the market until you get to the entranceway along the same wall to the right.

Tuk Tuk: Unless you are use to tuk tuk bargaining it might end up costing you more than a taxi to get there. If possible arrange a price beforehand with a little bargaining.
